Confession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds. God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. Gospel Reading | John 10.1-10

[1] "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in by another way, that man is a thief and a robber. [2] But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. [3] To him the gatekeeper opens. The sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. [4] When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. [5] A stranger they will not follow, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers." [6] This figure of speech Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

[7] So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. [8] All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. [9] I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. [10] The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

^{*}The term "catholic" here means "universal," not the Roman Catholic church. It refers to all believers, everywhere and at all times— the whole company of God's redeemed people through the ages.

Ministry of the Word | This Poor Man Cried

Sermon Text | Psalm 34

Leader: [1] I will bless the LORD at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth.

People: [2] My soul makes its boast in the LORD;

let the humble hear and be glad.

Leader: [3] Oh, magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together!

People: [4] I sought the LORD, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears.

Leader: [5] Those who look to him are radiant, and their faces shall never be ashamed.

People: [6] This poor man cried, and the LORD heard him

and saved him out of all his troubles. **Leader:** [7] The angel of the LORD encamps

around those who fear him, and delivers them.

Leader: [19] Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the LORD delivers him out of them all.

People: [20] He keeps all his bones; not one of them is broken.

Leader: [21] Affliction will slay the wicked,

and those who hate the righteous will be condemned.

People: [22] The LORD redeems the life of his servants;

none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned.
