Gospel Reading | Mark 5.21-43

[21] And when Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered about him, and he was beside the sea. [22] Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name, and seeing him, he fell at his feet [23] and implored him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live." [24] And he went with him.

And a great crowd followed him and thronged about him. [25] And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, [26] and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. [27] She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. [28] For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I will be made well." [29] And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. [30] And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone out from him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my garments?" [31] And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, 'Who touched me?'" [32] And he looked around to see who had done it. [33] But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him and told him the whole truth. [34] And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

[35] While he was still speaking, there came from the ruler's house some who said, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" [36] But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." [37] And he allowed no one to follow him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. [38] They came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and Jesus saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. [39] And when he had entered, he said to them, "Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping." [40] And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went in where the child was. [41] Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." [42] And immediately the girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement. [43] And he strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

Ministry of the Word | "O LORD, my God, you are very great!"

Sermon Text | Psalm 104

Leader: Bless the LORD, O my soul! O LORD my God, you are very great!

People: You are clothed with splendor and majesty, covering yourself with light as with a garment,

stretching out the heavens like a tent.

Leader: He lays the beams of his chambers on the waters; he makes the clouds his chariot; he

rides on the wings of the wind;

People: He makes his messengers winds, his ministers a flaming fire.

Leader: He set the earth on its foundations, so that it should never be moved.

People: You covered it with the deep as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains.

Leader: At your rebuke they fled; at the sound of your thunder they took to flight.

People: The mountains rose, the valleys sank down to the place that you appointed for them.

Leader: You set a boundary that they may not pass, so that they might not again cover the earth.

People: You make springs gush forth in the valleys; they flow between the hills; they give drink to every

beast of the field; the wild donkeys quench their thirst.

Leader: Beside them the birds of the heavens dwell; they sing among the branches.

People: From your lofty abode you water the mountains; the earth is satisfied with the fruit of your

work.

Leader: You cause the grass to grow for the livestock and plants for man to cultivate, that he may

bring forth food from the earth

People: And wine to gladden the heart of man, oil to make his face shine and bread to strengthen man's

heart.

Leader: The trees of the LORD are watered abundantly, the cedars of Lebanon that he planted.

People: In them the birds build their nests; the stork has her home in the fir trees.

Leader: The high mountains are for the wild goats; the rocks are a refuge for the rock badgers.

People: He made the moon to mark the seasons; the sun knows its time for setting.

Leader: You make darkness, and it is night, when all the beasts of the forest creep about.

People: The young lions roar for their prey, seeking their food from God.

Leader: When the sun rises, they steal away and lie down in their dens.

People: Man goes out to his work and to his labor until the evening.

Leader: O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom have you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

People: Here is the sea, great and wide, which teems with creatures innumerable, living things both

small and great.

Leader: There go the ships, and Leviathan, which you formed to play in it.

People: These all look to you, to give them their food in due season.

Leader: When you give it to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are filled

with good things.

People: When you hide your face, they are dismayed; when you take away their breath, they die and

return to their dust.

Leader: When you send forth your Spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the ground.

People: May the glory of the LORD endure forever; may the LORD rejoice in his works,

Leader: Who looks on the earth and it trembles, who touches the mountains and they smoke!

People: I will sing to the LORD as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have being.
