Opening Prayer

The First Candle and Old Testament Reading | Isaiah 60.1-6

[1] Arise, shine, for your light has come,
and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you.

[2] For behold, darkness shall cover the earth,
and thick darkness the peoples;
but the LORD will arise upon you,
and his glory will be seen upon you.

[3] And nations shall come to your light,
and kings to the brightness of your rising.

[4] Lift up your eyes all around, and see;
they all gather together, they come to you;
your sons shall come from afar,
and your daughters shall be carried on the hip.

[5] Then you shall see and be radiant;
your heart shall thrill and exult,
because the abundance of the sea shall be turned to you,
the wealth of the nations shall come to you.

The Fourth Candle and Gospel Reading | Luke 2.1-17

[1] In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. [2] This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. [3] And all went to be registered, each to his own town. [4] And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, [5] to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. [6] And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. [7] And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

[8] And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. [9] And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. [10] And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. [11] For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. [12] And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." [13] And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

[14] "Glory to God in the highest,
and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

[15] When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." [16] And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. [17] And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child.

The Christ Candle and Homily | But When She Has Delivered the Baby

Homily Text | John 16.20-24

[20] Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice. You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy. [21] When a woman is giving birth, she has sorrow because her hour has come, but when she has delivered the baby, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. [22] So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. [23] In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. [24] Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full.

The Second Candle and Epistle Reading | Luke 1.46b-55

[46] And Mary said,
"My soul magnifies the Lord,
[47] and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,
[48] for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant.
For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed;
[49] for he who is mighty has done great things for me,
and holy is his name.
[50] And his mercy is for those who fear him
from generation to generation.
[51] He has shown strength with his arm;
he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts;
[52] he has brought down the mighty from their thrones
and exalted those of humble estate;
[53] he has filled the hungry with good things,
and the rich he has sent away empty.
[54] He has helped his servant Israel,
in remembrance of his mercy,
[55] as he spoke to our fathers,
to Abraham and to his offspring forever."

The Third Candle and Psalm | Psalm 132

Leader: Remember, O LORD, in David's favor, all the hardships he endured,

People: *How he swore to the LORD and vowed to the Mighty One of Jacob,*

Leader: "I will not enter my house or get into my bed,

People: *I will not give sleep to my eyes or slumber to my eyelids,*

Leader: Until I find a place for the LORD, a dwelling place for the Mighty One of Jacob."

People: *Behold, we heard of it in Ephrathah; we found it in the fields of Jaar.*

Leader: "Let us go to his dwelling place; let us worship at his footstool!"

People: *Arise, O LORD, and go to your resting place, you and the ark of your might.*

Leader: Let your priests be clothed with righteousness, and let your saints shout for joy.

People: *For the sake of your servant David, do not turn away the face of your anointed one.*

Leader: The LORD swore to David a sure oath from which he will not turn back: "One of the sons of your body I will set on your throne.

People: *If your sons keep my covenant and my testimonies that I shall teach them, their sons also forever shall sit on your throne."*

Leader: For the LORD has chosen Zion; he has desired it for his dwelling place:

People: *"This is my resting place forever; here I will dwell, for I have desired it.*

Leader: I will abundantly bless her provisions; I will satisfy her poor with bread.

People: *Her priests I will clothe with salvation, and her saints will shout for joy.*

Leader: There I will make a horn to sprout for David; I have prepared a lamp for my anointed.

People: *His enemies I will clothe with shame, but on him his crown will shine."*
